The Chicago History Museum is giving away a wedding in conjunction with its upcoming exhibition

CHICAGO (February 9, 2010) – The Chicago History Museum is giving one lucky couple a historic wedding they will never forget. Newly engaged Chicago couples are encouraged to share their proposal story with the Museum to win the Ultimate Chicago Wedding. The Museum wants to know how Chicagoans propose, and the more Chicago themed, the better. “Collecting the stories of Chicagoans is one of the things we do best,” said Gary T. Johnson, Museum president. “We are excited to learn what makes us as Chicagoans unique in our proposals.” This promotion is being held in conjunction with the Museum’s upcoming wedding exhibition, *I Do! Chicago Ties the Knot* opening on Saturday, May 22. The exhibition celebrates Chicago’s wedding customs and traditions using the Museum’s extensive costume collection of wedding garments.

Three finalists will be selected, and the grand prize winner will be selected by an online vote from March 17 through April 9. The lucky couple will win an intimate wedding ceremony and reception at the Chicago History Museum for up to 75 people; a catered three course dinner provided by Food For Thought; a weekend for two at the Palmer House Hilton’s penthouse including a custom honeymoon dinner for two in the LOCKWOOD restaurant, and limo transportation for the couple to and from the hotel; photography services by Amanda Hein Photography, wedding planning services by LK Events, DJ services from Fig Media for the reception; and a Mario Tricoci Pre-Wedding Package.
